Charging and Remissions Policy 2022

1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 All education during school hours is free. We do not charge for any activity undertaken as part of the Foundation Stage Curriculum.

1.2 The Governing Body recognises the valuable contribution that the wide range of additional activities, including practical activities and visits can make towards pupil's personal and social education. The Governing Body aims to promote and provide such activities both as part of a broad and balanced curriculum for the pupils of the school and as additional, optional activities

2 Voluntary contributions

2.1 When organising educational visits to enrich the curriculum and the educational experience of the children, the school invites parents to contribute to the cost. All contributions are voluntary. If we do not receive sufficient voluntary contributions, we may have to cancel the visit.. If a visit goes ahead we will always include children whose parents have not paid any contribution. We do not treat children differently from any others.

2.2 The cost of some trips will be subsidised by Early Years Pupil Premium funding for those children entitled to it.

2.2 The 1988 Education Act draws a distinction between the term 'charges ' which are considered to be an obligatory cost and 'voluntary contributions ' which are self-explanatory.

2.3 Subsidies from various sources e.g. grants , Kay Rowe school fund, Children's Centre private fund, voluntary organizations, will be used to cover the deficits. 2.4 Whenever possible, the school will give sufficient notice to allow parents / carers to pay by instalments.

2.5 If a parent wishes their child to take part in an educational visit or activity, but is unwilling or unable to make a voluntary contribution, we always ensure the child is able to participate fully in the trip or activity. Sometimes the school pays additional costs in order to support the visit. Parents have a right to know how each visit is funded. The school provides this information on request.

2.6 The following is a list of additional activities, organised by the school which may require voluntary contributions from parents.

This list is not exhaustive:

Weekly contribution of 50p or termly £5 to cover the cost of healthy snack/cooking ingredients

Visits to museums;

Forest school

Visits to or by a theatre company;

School visits

musical events

transport
